

St Nicolas & St Mary CE Primary School

Remote Learning Plan Autumn 2020

Since 7th September 2020, all year groups have been welcomed back to St Nicolas and St Mary's. Children are taught in separate class bubbles.

Class teachers and support staff are aware that the past six months has had a significant impact on the school community which is why at St Nicolas and St Mary, our primary aim continued to be the safety and well-being of all our staff and pupils. We recognise that any further full/partial school closure will impact differently on all of us and we acknowledge that children and families will face a variety of situations and challenges which is why we have put in place robust contingency plans.

Since the start of the Autumn term all children have had:

- Regular breaks for physical activity
- Opportunities to share experiences in PSHE lessons
- Time to talk to staff and their friends
- Tasks that are manageable and supported with differentiated resources

Some children have required additional support which could include an intervention with another member of staff or the use of a specific resource.

As a school we have partnered with a successful digital technology school to provide whole staff and bespoke CPD training on remote learning*. This training has been invaluable and we intend to continue this partnership to further develop our remote and blending learning provision to our children.

We have outlined below our digital/remote learning conintengency plan based upon four scenarios:

- I. An individual pupil is told to self-isolate
- 2. Full school or class/year group bubble closure (EYFS/KSI)
- 3. Full school or class/year group bubble closure (KS2)
- 4. A Class bubble has been told to isolate and the teacher is unwell
- *The platform for this training has been through Google technology. This has meant our school has decided to use **GOOGLE CLASSROOM / EVIDENCE ME** as its main system for remote lesson presentation. (Where appropriate we may also use **See Saw** and **Youtube** video for demonstration purposes.)

All children in EYFS (Nursery and Reception) will be able to access Evidence Me using your login details shared earlier in the term.

All children from Year I will have been introduced to Google classroom. They will have been set up with passwords and know how to access it, parents will be given some instructional material as soon as possible.*
