1. To improve the provision of PE at St Nicolas and St Mary CE Primary School
2. To provide CPD opportunities for school teaching staff – Teachers and teaching assistants.
3. Broaden the range of sporting opportunities and clubs for all children (including those identified as least active).
4. To increase the range of intra and inter school competitions for children.

Evaluation of Key Issues 2015-16:

1. Construction of Multi-use Games area – Additional playground

This has proved difficult this year with the ongoing delays to the buildings work for the school to become fully 2FE. The additional all weather multi-use area in KSI has been invaluable and it is great to know that as part of the build work we will receive a full netball court size multi-use area. The additional funds put aside for this will be used to invest in adventurous activity equipment.

2. Sign-up and maximise opportunities form Shoreham Academy support-Improving provision. 2a Professional Development for Staff.

The school, for a third year signed up for the extended package of support from Shoreham Academy PE department. The £2000 has been spent on the continued participation and support with intra and inter school competitions. The additional support has been centred on adopting the New National Curriculum and how to plan a challenging and progressive skills based school curriculum.

The school has invested the Sports Premium funding into CPD for teachers and Teaching Assistants. The CPD has seen an increase in confidence for staff and both teachers and Teaching assistants have used this confidence to take on personal sporting activities including (for the first time) joining a ladies netball team.

A Teaching Assistant has just completed the ASA Level 1 swimming qualification, ensuring that children have three instructors teaching the children all with a minimum of Level 1 teaching (from 2 the previous academic year), a key area which we feel will show long term benefits to the school and the children.

3. Increased Participation Levels

This year has seen a significant increase in the % of children taking part in school based sporting clubs:

- Participation in school led multi-sports clubs has increased by 10% to 72 children.
- All other staff and external provider clubs have seen an increase in participation levels with several clubs having waiting lists for places. This has included the introduction of a separate EYFS/KS1 football club and additional KS2 Football club. We have also been pleased to introduce new sports to the children, including a before school fencing club.

4. Range of Intra and inter-school competitions

The school has continued to participate in an extensive range of inter school competitions run through our link with Shoreham Academy. The school took part in 12+ competitions through our local schools cluster and one Sussex schools based cricket festival. Children from Key Stage Two qualified for partnership finals in Cross country and Rugby. In addition, the school had a child reach and participate in the County Final. Intra School competitions took part with all children from Foundation Stage to Upper Key Stage 2.

2016-17 Key Issues:

- Increased range of extra-curricular activities for expanding school (Clubs, Intra and inter school competition. Greater range of before school, lunchtime and after school clubs (including fitness – 10 minute mile).
- Planning and assessment progression across Key Stage 1 and 2 based on expectation of New National Curriculum.
- Ensure children are engaged in the build-up and values of the Rio 2016 Olympics.
- Continue to provide all teaching staff (Teachers and TAs) with high quality CPD.
- Increase pupil independence in PE – sports leaders.
