Key Facts

- Rome was founded in Italy by Romulus in 753 BC
- The Roman Empire spread across Europe, parts of Asia and North Africa.
- The Roman army was far more powerful and effective than contemporary armies and was a structured hierarchical system.
- Before the Roman conquest, Britain was a collection of Celtic tribes.
- Roman Britain was a province of the Roman Empire from 43AD to 410AD.
- When the Romans came to Britain, they brought their way of life with them.
- In 60BC, Boudicca, Queen of the Iceni tribe, led.
  a rebellion against Roman rule.

- The Romans built Hadrian's Wall to keep the Scottish tribes out of England.
- The Romans built Britain's first towns. These included houses, shops, meeting spaces, workshops, temples and bathhouses.
- The Romans built the first roads in Britain. The roads were so well built that you can still see some of them today.
- In around 200 AD, Emperor Constantine made Christianity the religion of the Roman Empire.
- The Roman Britain era ended when many Roman soldiers returned to Italy to defend it against fierce Goth tribes.
- Roman. Legacy: The Romans built brick houses, roads and towns, introduced Christianity, laid the foundations of our legal system and influenced our language.
