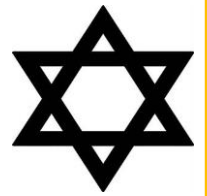

- The Holocaust: Six million Jews were murdered by the Nazis in WW2
- Auschwitz was a concentration camp where many Jews were sent.

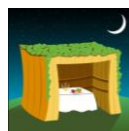
Sacred Text & Special Items/People:
