- 3. **BLACK HISTORY MONTH:** October is Black History Month and in school we will be taking part in various activities to mark the occasion and celebrate diversity in general. On Wednesday 6th October each year group will be taking part in an African workshop (either storytelling or dance). Throughout the month we will be researching many black historical figures and reading books written by black authors/books containing characters from different ethnic backgrounds.
 - On the last day of this half term Friday 22nd October we will be supporting the charity Show Racism the Red Card https://www.theredcard.org/ All children may wear an item of red clothing to school that day (other clothing worn should be school uniform) and we are asking for a suggested £1 donation (which can be given to class teachers on the day) to raise money for the charity.

- **5. RECRUITMENT**: We are seeking to recruit an Administrative Assistant to join the team and continue to provide a welcoming and efficient service to parents/carers, staff, governors, visitors and, most importantly, children who make up our friendly school community. - 6. BRAIN BUILDING LEARNING UPDATE: This week, the children in KS1/2 have been learning all about 'Brain Shaping'. We learnt that positive and calming experiences make our brains grow stronger and help us to be more resilient. Similarly, stressful or anxiety-provoking situations might stop our brains functioning as well as they can. We learnt that we can 'rewire' our brain to create new, more helpful 'habits' and strengthen areas of the brain which control things we find more difficult. We also discovered that all of our brains are as unique and special as our eyes or hair colour and that some brains work in different ways to other people's.
- 7. **HOME READING BOOKLETS IN KS1:** KS1 children will soon be bringing home a Home Reading Booklet, where parents can tick when they have read with their child and add in any comments about their child's progress at home. Booklets will contain full instructions and top tips for home reading. When your child has read at home ten times, they will be given a lucky book token to enter into a prize draw to win a new book. - **8. EARRINGS IN SCHOOL:** Lots of children are missing out on PE lessons at the moment due to them not being able to remove their earrings. Please ensure your child can remove their earrings or do not have them in on PE days. Below is an extract from the uniform policy regarding earrings:

Jewellery, Hair and Make-up and other accessories

- No jewellery to be worn except small stud earrings or cross on chain, which have to be removed for PE by the child. Covering earrings with micropore tape is not sufficient (this is in accordance with local authority policy and advice).
- Members of staff are not permitted to remove or insert earrings and cannot accept responsibility for the safe keeping of such items.
- 9. CAULIFLOWER CHRISTMAS CARDS: Each Child will be bringing home a Christmas card design pack where they can design their own card, gift wrap or labels. Please follow the instructions inside the form. Once your child has designed the card you will need to order your product online and return the form along with the artwork to the school office. II. HEALTH AND SAFETY:

- Parking: This week, due to bad parking outside of school, there was an incident which nearly led to a serious accident. Do not park on the double yellow lines outside of school, the zig zag lines, the bus stop or on street corners. It is dangerous and illegal. If you see someone parking in such a way, please report them through this website www.operationcrackdown.org You just need to include the registration number, make and model of car, location of the incident.
 - The school senior leadership team will be getting out more regularly to patrol the area around the school (Park Road)I (You will spot us in our brightly fluorescent bibs!)
 - We are looking to contact the local police community support team to make patrols of the area at drop off/pick up times.
- Dogs: dogs are not allowed on the school premises, this includes the car
 park. Dogs should be tied up on the rings which are along the fence outside the school. Please clear up any mess
 your dog leaves.



12. CORONAVIRUS - IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- What to do if your child has symptoms: please do not send in your child if they have symptoms e.g. a persistent cough. Please arrange for your child to have a PCR test as soon as possible. Your child cannot attend school again until they have received a negative test result or they have isolated for 10 days.
- What to do if your child has a positive PCR test: please inform the school and keep your child in isolation for 10 days as advised by the NHS.
- What to do if you or a member of your household has a positive PCR test: we recommend that you arrange a PCR test for all other members of your household before sending your child into school.

- 13. SCHOOL CENSUS, THURSDAY 7th OCTOBER: It is vital that we secure the full level of funding to which we are entitled for Free School Meals. The government provides funding for each child that has a free school meal on the two census dates in October and January. If your child is entitled to a free school meal (including all children in YR, I and 2) they will be offered a hot meal on these dates, therefore they do not need to bring in a packed lunch. If your child has a dietary requirement that Chartwells are not already aware of please follow the link to read the West Sussex Special Diet Process which includes a form to return to Chartwells, otherwise you need take no further action (please see the Children's Choice Menu attached to the bulletin).

Did you know?

Children aged 6-12 need nine to twelve hours sleep each night and those aged 13-18 need between eight and ten hours a night. Having an appropriate amount of sleep means that they can pay attention better in school, remember what they've learned, feel good about themselves, have a healthy weight and make good choices. Those who are sleep deprived are more likely to feel sad, anxious or hopeless, become overweight, or use cigarettes, drugs or alcohol.

What can you try?

1. Teach them!

Sleep is a skill and for some children, it doesn't come naturally! Teaching them about the benefits of sleep can help but it's also important to teach them HOW to get to sleep. Explain the importance of winding down (by having a bath to relax muscles, or deep breathing), limiting blue light (from screens) on the run up to bedtime, and that certain smells (like lavender) can be soothing and help sleep. It's also good for them to know that it's NORMAL to take up to 40 minutes or longer for some people to get to sleep. The important thing is to stay in bed so their body and mind can rest. Emphasise rest over sleep.

2. Allow them some control

Some children – for example older children, or those with autism – benefit from having input into their own routine. For example, banning screens completely might cause more issues than it solves! An alternative could be suggesting that they put it into night mode, so they don't have the blue light (that tricks their brain into thinking it's daytime) and deciding together an appropriate time to put technology away. Enforcing a rule that has been agreed leads to much less conflict than enforcing one that has suddenly been imposed!

3. Watch what they eat

Some foods and drinks are well known for containing stimulants that keep people awake – coffee, tea, fizzy drinks. However, foods containing tyramine triggers the release of a brain stimulant and is found in a range of foods such as cheese, ham, pepperoni – so that pizza late at night might be a bad idea! Foods like bread or cereal are better choices as they trigger the release of a chemical that make people feel sleepy.


