## Did you know?

According to psychologist William B. Swann's self-verification theory, human beings like to be consistent. Our need for self-confirmation is much stronger than our need for self-enhancement or self-improvement. This is, of course, only one theory and is in opposition to a lot of other philosophical and psychological viewpoints. However, it is definitely worth examining whether this could apply to you.

## What can you try?

### 1. Find patterns

Ask yourself - what do I do over and over again that doesn't help me? Identifying these patterns is the first step to changing them. If William B. Swann is right, then although self-change is really hard, it is not impossible... as although we are prone to do one thing, it is within our capacity to change it.

### 2. Listen to your own stories

Listen carefully to the voice in your head. If you find yourself doing something that doesn't move you forward, be alert to self-talk such as — 'this is how I always do it', 'it will be easier if I don't change things', 'this is what I'm like', 'people will expect me to do x'. If these are the stories you are telling yourself, it's quite likely your own self-limiting beliefs are preventing you from improving things for yourself.

### 3. Set goals

One way to notice if you're clinging to your own familiar perceptions of yourself, is to become more aware of your ideal self and what that would look like. Setting goals is a fundamental part of many theories relating to personal wellbeing (CBT and coaching to name a couple). Make sure your goals are SMART (specific, measurable, achievable, realistic and time-bound). Also, keep in mind that in the last few decades, empirical research has shown that having goals, and actively working towards them, impacts positively on stress, anxiety and depression.
