7. Octopus & Starfish Clubs

Octopus Club: could we please ask parents/carers to wait with their child until they have been registered at the Octopus Club with a member of staff. We have to be careful about numbers due to staffing ratios and are unable to admit children unless they have been booked in. Thank you.

- 8. Music Room Display: Miss Ellis would like to create a display in the Music Room celebrating the children's musical achievements. If your child has passed a music exam and would like their certificate to be displayed, please send in a photocopy or send in the original which Miss Ellis will photocopy and return. Additionally, if your child has played in a concert and you have a photo of their performance they would like to share, please send in the same way. Thank you.
- 9. Jewellery, Hair and Make-up and other accessories: we have noticed that a number of children are wearing the wrong hair accessories or nail varnish. Please see the extract below from our uniform policy:
 - No jewellery to be worn except small stud earrings or cross on chain, which have to be removed for PE by the child. Covering earrings with micropore tape is not sufficient (this is in accordance with local authority policy and advice).
 - Long hair to be tied back with accessories in school colours (eg blue and white), for health and safety reasons, and must not be excessively large. Hair gel <u>must not</u> be worn.
 - Make-up, nail varnish or tattoo style transfers must not be worn to school.
- 10. Junk Modelling: Gray Whales would be very grateful for any donations of SMALL junk modelling items such as pots, small boxes etc. Please pass to the class teacher at pick up or drop off.
- 11. Recycling School Badges for Eco Councillors, School Councillors and Dream Team: we are very grateful for the support of all of the children who helped the school by participating in the School Council, Eco Council and Dream Team last year. As we are an Eco School and also trying to be as cost efficient as possible, we would be very grateful if any councillors from last year could return their badges so that they can be re-used this year. Many thanks for your help with this.
- 12. School Census, Thursday 3rd October: It is vital that we secure the full level of funding to which we are entitled for Free School Meals. The government provides funding for each child that has a free school meal on the two census dates of 3rd October and 16th January. If your child is entitled to a free school meal (including all children in YR, I and 2) they will be offered a hot meal on these dates, even if they do not normally have a hot meal; therefore they do not need to bring in a packed lunch on this day. If your child has a dietary requirement that Chartwells are not already aware of please follow the link to read the West Sussex Special Diet Process which includes a form to return to Chartwells, otherwise you need take no further action (please see the Children's Choice Menu attached to the bulletin).
- 13. Hot School Meals special requests: A number of parents have requested that their children are served pasta without any sauce. Chartwells are required to serve a balanced diet in line with School Food Standards set by the government. Therefore, they are not able to offer pasta without sauce. Children that don't like this dish can choose an alternative. If your child requires a special diet please follow the link and read the <u>West Sussex</u> <u>Special Diet Process</u>.
- 14. Social media: As a school we completely understand that parents will be conversing with each other on social media platforms such as Facebook. I7. Health and Safety

- **PARKING:** we are extremely concerned about where parents/carers are parking when dropping off/picking up from school. Some people (often the same ones day after day) are parking on the zig zags, in the school bus zone, up on the kerb and in front of residents' drives. <u>Do not park in these places</u> it is dangerous and puts all our children at risk, as well as causing congestion on the road. There is parking available over at Buckingham Park or on nearby roads. **PLEASE PLEASE PLEASE** park carefully and considerately.
- **Reporting bad or inconsiderate parking:** <u>Anybody</u> can report bad or inconsiderate parking by going to <u>www.operationcrackdown.org</u> You just need to include the registration number, make and model of car, location of the incident. We would encourage any parent/carer who witnesses dangerous parking to report it immediately.
- **Staff car park:** we would like to remind you that you <u>must not</u> use the staff car park for dropping off or picking up children at any time. The car park is extremely busy with staff arriving/departing, visitors and deliveries. Please make sure you always use the footpath between the hedge and the fence when coming in to the school. Could you also please let any other members of your family know. Thank you.

18. School Calendar: as part of our ongoing efforts to improve how we share information with parents and carers we are investigating using a Google Calendar on our website, which would provide easier access to information about school events. A useful feature of Google Calendar is that parents and carers would also be able to subscribe to the school calendars which means that new dates are automatically sent to your calendar or email. If you currently use Google Calendar you would then be able to see school events on your personal electronic calendar alongside your other commitments.

In order to ensure parents and carers could access relevant dates for their family, we propose setting up separate calendars for each year group as well as a calendar for whole school events and a calendar for clubs. PhD Research: Is modern technology effecting children's posture and muscles?

The University of Salford is conducting some research looking at children between 7-17 and their usage of personal electronic devices (including smart phones, tablets, laptops and desktop computer) and the effects on postural, physical and musculoskeletal systems. The aim of the PhD is to understand the usage of PEDs in schoolchildren and explore whether this usage is a risk factor to musculoskeletal symptoms (MSK), postural and physiological changes over time.
