- 4. **INDIVIDUAL PHOTOS FRIDAY 24**th **SEPTEMBER:** Please send your child in with their school jumper and looking smart in their correct uniform ready for their individual school photo on Friday. We will send out more information about sibling photos next week.
- 5. **RECRUITMENT:** We are currently looking to recruit a **Premises Assistant**. Duties would include minor maintenance and basic DIY, light grounds maintenance, managing cleaning supplies and general caretaking duties and opening up the building in the morning and locking up at the end of the day. - **6. UNIFORM:** Please ensure your child is wearing the correct school uniform to school. Trainers, leggings and boots are not allowed. 8. PARKING:

- Parking: yet again, we find ourselves having to ask all parents and carers to be considerate when dropping off/picking up their children. We are extremely concerned that some parents/carers are repeatedly parking on the zig zags, in the school bus zone, up on the kerb and in front of residents' drives. Do not park in these places it is dangerous and puts all our children at risk, as well as causing congestion on the road. There is parking available over at Buckingham Park or on nearby roads. PLEASE PLEASE PLEASE park carefully and considerately. The school will not hesitate to report such incidents to the police. This includes dropping off/picking up from the Octopus and Starfish clubs and any other after school clubs.
- Reporting bad or inconsiderate parking: <u>Anybody</u> can report bad or inconsiderate parking by going to
 <u>www.operationcrackdown.org</u> You just need to include the registration number, make and model of car, location
 of the incident. We would encourage any parent/carer who witnesses dangerous parking to report it
 immediately.
- **Staff car park:** Could we please remind you that parents/carers <u>must not</u> use the staff car park unless they have been given prior permission to do so. The car park is extremely busy with staff arriving/departing, visitors and deliveries. Please make sure you always use the footpath between the hedge and the fence when coming in to the school. Could you also please let any other members of your family know. Thank you.

9. SICKNESS

- Sickness & Diarrhoea: please do not send your child to school if they are unwell. Although we wish to encourage good attendance, children who are ill must stay at home. Please note in particular that if a child has had sickness and/or diarrhoea they must not come back to school/nursery until 48 hours after the last bout of vomiting/diarrhoea.

- 15. SCHOOL CENSUS, THURSDAY 7th OCTOBER: It is vital that we secure the full level of funding to which we are entitled for Free School Meals. The government provides funding for each child that has a free school meal on the two census dates in October and January. If your child is entitled to a free school meal (including all children in YR, I and 2) they will be offered a hot meal on these dates, therefore they do not need to bring in a packed lunch. If your child has a dietary requirement that Chartwells are not already aware of please follow the link to read the West Sussex Special Diet Process which includes a form to return to Chartwells, otherwise you need take no further action (please see the Children's Choice Menu attached to the bulletin).
