PHONICS NEWSFLASH...

At St Nics, we follow the Read Write Inc programme which is a comprehensive scheme for teaching reading. The lessons are taught daily to Reception up to Year 2 classes (with some KS2 children taking part if needed) and is a proven way of developing the basic reading skills, building general confidence and helping to install the love of reading into our pupils.



Mission statement from Read Write Inc:

- "...Put the teaching of reading at the heart of their schools and ensure teachers have the knowledge and determination to teach every child, regardless of age, background or need..."
- "...choose the best books to read aloud so children might read them for themselves..."
 - "...place literature as the central pillar in establishing all children's identity..."

As a staff, we have just undertaken some extra/top-up training with one of the experts from Read Write Inc and is was an invaluable day! We also now have access to the Read Write Inc Portal which is a fantastic resource that can be used by staff and parents as a help to support at home and reinforce what we do and teach at school.

To find out more about how Read Write Inc works and what you can do as parents and carers to help, we have a Read write Inc meeting on Thursday 24th October which you are all invited to. During these sessions, we will go over the expectations of the scheme, inform you how we teach the sounds/strategies, clearly outline what books should be going home, talk through the Portal (and its benefits for you) and answer any other questions that you may have.

We know you are all very busy so have arranged two sessions:

First session: 9am – 9.40am Thursday 24th October 2024

Second session: 2.30pm - 3.10pm Thursday 24th October 2024


Are you looking for something new to read? Would you like to discover a new author's work and find a new favourite? Check out the recommendations below for some inspiration:


Jabari Jumps Gaia Cornwall




Can you Get Rainbows in Space? Dr Sheila Kanani
