5. Christian Values Creativity Competition - LAST CHANCE

Any entries for the creativity competition based around our values must be in by the end of next week. If your child would like to enter - the guidelines are below: Entries can be based on any or all our school values (Creativity, Friendship, Compassion and Respect). They can work independently or as part of a group with their peers (demonstrating friendship).

Entries can include:

- A painting, drawing or collage no bigger than A4 size.
- A sculpture or model eg lego/junk modelling (or a photo of it if easier)
- A piece of creative writing such as a story, poem, prayer or poster
- A photograph they have taken to demonstrate the theme
- Performance of a song or piece of music linked to a value
- Performance of a dance or gymnastics routine linked to a value

All entries should be clearly labelled with the child or children's names and class names, and state which value/values they have chosen. 
