Key Facts

- Christopher Columbus was born in 1451 in Italy.
- At this time, many people were building new ships to explore different parts of the world.
- Christopher Columbus lived at a time when people in Europe did not know that the continents of North or South America existed.
- He learnt to sail and to find the way at sea by using the stars and the sun.
- He had a dream to travel west and go to China.
- The King and Queen of Spain gave him money to buy ships. He set sail on 3rd August 1492 with three ships: The Nina, The Pinta and The Santa Maria.

- After 36 days, a sailor spotted an island. It was in the Bahamas.
- Columbus sailed onto Cuba and discovered what became known as 'The New World'.
- Columbus made four voyages to the 'New World'.
- He died in 1506.
- It is now believed that Vikings had landed in America 500 years before Columbus!

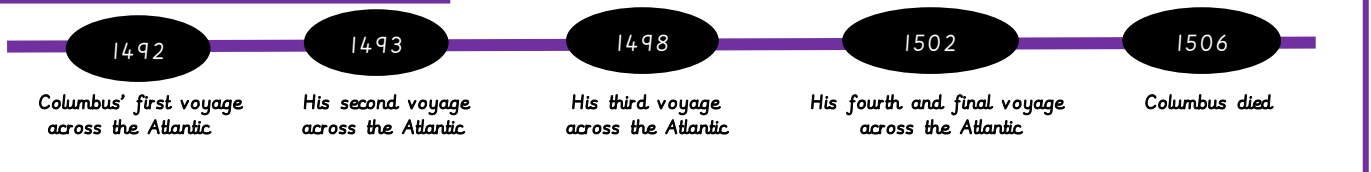
