#### 9. Premises, Health & Safety

- **Be Net Aware:** Follow this link to use <u>NSPCC's fantastic guide</u> to inform yourself about the social networks, apps and games that your child may be accessing online.
- Sickness & Diarrhoea: please do not send your child to school if they are unwell. Although we wish to encourage good attendance, children who are ill must stay at home. Please note in particular that if a child has had sickness and/or diarrhoea they must not come back to school/nursery until 48 hours after the last bout of vomiting/diarrhoea. Please see the Guidance on infection control in schools and other childcare settings issued by Public Health England (link below) and consult your doctor if you are in any doubt whether to send your child to school or not. Guidance on infection control in schools

- Lockdown: Our primary aim is the safety and wellbeing of our pupils and we practise fire drills and lockdown drills to help us to respond to a potential incident either in the community or directly affecting the school, whilst minimising disruption to learning. Next week we will be telling the children that we are going to practise our lockdown drill and that we are all going to pretend that Albert the Donkey is loose in the allotments and so everyone needs to stay inside their classroom and close doors and windows until we are sure that it is safe. It is important to carry out a lockdown drill so that in the unlikely event of an emergency that requires the school to be locked down, staff and children know what to do. Parents should be aware that in the event of a real incident requiring lockdown the following actions may be taken:
  - > Staff will ensure all pupils are inside the school buildings and lock any outside doors and close any windows that may be open;
  - If pupils are outside, staff will bring them back into their classrooms;
  - A register will be taken and any pupil not present will be notified to senior staff who will arrange a search for the missing pupil;
  - > Site and office staff will ensure all external doors are secured and closed;
  - Emergency services will be notified;
  - A message will be sent to parents /carers via our normal systems to advise of the emergency;
  - Pupils will not be released from the school until the all clear is given;
  - Parents/Carers MUST NOT try to contact the school or come to the school until the all clear has been given. This can both block essential routes of communications and hamper the emergency services.


Potential hazards for which a lockdown might be appropriate are:


- I. A reported incident, disturbance in the local community;
- 2. An intruder on the site;
- 3. A warning being received regarding a local risk of air pollution e.g. smoke plume, gas cloud;
- 4. A major fire in the vicinity of the school;
- 5. The close proximity of a dangerous dog.


