- 7. DANGEROUS PARKING: this term parking outside and around the school has gradually got worse and this week it has been horrendous with people parking in front of residents' driveways, parking on corners, up on kerbs, on double yellow lines and on the zig zags. DO NOT PARK IN THESE PLACES it is dangerous and puts all our children at risk, as well as causing congestion on the road. There is parking available over at Buckingham Park or on nearby roads. PLEASE PLEASE PLEASE park carefully and considerately. The school will not hesitate to report such incidents to the police. This includes dropping off/picking up from the Octopus and Starfish clubs and any other after school clubs. Reporting bad/inconsiderate parking: Anybody can report bad/inconsiderate parking by going to www.operationcrackdown.org You need to include the registration number, make & model of car, location of the incident. We would encourage any parent/carer who witnesses dangerous parking to report it immediately.

8. HEALTH & SAFETY - CORONAVIRUS

- Face Coverings: We wanted to say a big thank you to those parents/carers who have been wearing face coverings at pick up and drop off times this week. We understand that this can be a difficult area with strong feelings on both sides which is why we will still be continuing to 'encourage' rather than make mandatory (which is the case in many schools locally). Alongside this we are aware that some people are exempt from the need to wear face coverings, which is why we will not be challenging people on the playground.
- Ventilation: The government has this week updated their guidance for schools and have put a priority on ensuring all classrooms and learning areas are well ventilated. This will mean that the temperature in classes will be less as a consequence of the need to constantly have windows open. We therefore would ask that

children come to school with appropriate clothing which may mean vests under school shirts/polo shirts, jumpers, school colour (and logo) fleeces and warm coats. Thankfully the weather has been warm so far however it is best to prepared as we enter winter and the drop in temperatures that will follow.

The club is on sale for year group bubbles and is scheduled to run for years 1 & 2 on a Tuesday, years 5 & 6 on a Wednesday, and years 3 & 4 on a Thursday. There will be two instructors for each day so the children can be kept in their years without mixing, and of course as always we will be outside at all times! in order for the club to be viable for us we do need 15+ children to sign up for each day so please get booking, in the event that we do not have the numbers to run on a particular day your place will of course be fully refunded. We are also delighted to announce that starting on the 7th November we will be running 5hr holiday club style sessions every Saturday at St Nics. It would be great to see you there! We can't wait to be back! See you soon, Rob and the team.



I hope you are well and that COVID-19 has not affected you or your family too badly? I am writing to you to ask if you are able to help us with the Shoebox Appeal this year.


