This will help to ensure that in the case of a positive test result, contacts of the person can self isolate promptly to prevent further spread of infection to the wider community.

REQUESTS & REMINDERS

- 8. MORNING DROP-OFF: During early morning work, just after drop off, teaching assistants are often reading quietly with children in the corridor near the YI Classes. This is an important time for settling the children quietly and helping them make progress with their reading or engaging them with other activities in the classroom. We have noticed that some parents are trying to say an additional goodbye to their children through the East Ark Door as they exit from the playground. We would be most grateful if parents could refrain from doing this as it causes disruption to those who are trying to teach and learn. Please ensure you say goodbye only at the classroom door near the trim trail. Many thanks for your support in this.
- 9. DANGEROUS PARKING: we are still receiving concerns and complaints from residents about the dangerous and inconsiderate parking outside and around the school. People must not park in front of residents' driveways, on corners, up on kerbs, on double yellow lines or on the zig zags. DO NOT PARK IN THESE PLACES it is dangerous and puts all our children at risk, as well as causing congestion on the road. There is parking available over at Buckingham Park or on nearby roads. PLEASE PLEASE park carefully and considerately. The school will not hesitate to report such incidents to the police. This includes dropping off/picking up from the Octopus and Starfish clubs and any other after school clubs. Reporting bad/inconsiderate parking: Anybody can report bad/inconsiderate parking by going to www.operationcrackdown.org You need to include the registration number, make & model of car, location of the incident. We would encourage any parent/carer who witnesses dangerous parking to report it immediately.

- 10. TOYS IN SCHOOL: Please can children refrain from bringing small toys into school, including trading cards. We have had an increasing number of children bringing in items from home, particularly in KSI. This is distracting learning but also not safe from a Covid-19 point of view. The only exceptions may be if it is an agreed transitional object, which has been authorised by the SEND team. Many thanks for your support in this.
