We will be learning about the Tudors this term including the Battle of Bosworth, Henry VIII and his wives and Elizabeth I.



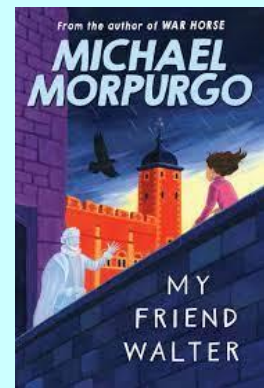
Topic

Maths

For the first part of the summer term, we will be learning about money and then time. Any opportunities you can take to help your child while you are out and about would be really beneficial. Eg working out the total cost of something you are buying, how much change you will get, how long until the bus comes, how long until dinner time ect

Times Tables

The Multiplication Tables Check, held nationally for year 4 pupils, will take place in **June 25**. More details on this to follow.

Please continue to help your child to learn their times tables up to 12×12 . Remember that they also need to understand how we relate the multiplication facts to the division facts:-

$$3 \times 6 = 18$$

$$\text{so, } 18 \div 6 = 3 \text{ and}$$

$$18 \div 3 = 6$$

Home reading.

Please encourage your child to read every night.

Children in Y4 are often able to read independently but they still benefit from some time reading with an adult. Adults can question children and help them to have a deeper understanding of the book.

Please ensure your child brings a named water bottle to school...especially now that the weather is finally turning warmer.
