

Here are a set of basic instructions showing how to dress as a Roman soldier.



Basic Instructions

1. Pull on a woollen tunic.
2. Tie around a belt.
3. Strap on some sandals (caligae).
4. Put on some body armour.
5. Place on a helmet (cassis).
6. Pick up your shield (scutum).

Today, you will need to improve some instructions using adverbs, adverbial phrases or fronted adverbials (see word mat resources for support with these). You should also add detail as to why the Roman soldiers would need to wear some of the items (protection, warmth etc.).

Here are some examples from a WAGOLL (What A Good One Looks Like):

1. *Firstly, pull on your woollen tunic to keep you warm and stop your body armour from rubbing.*
4. *After that, quietly put on your body armour so you don't wake the enemy.*
6. *Quickly, grab your shield and prepare for battle!*
