





Hello and welcome to the Year 4 Seahorse and Sea Otter Self- Isolation Guide! w/b 16th Nov 20



If you are poorly, you might not be up to doing lots of work. However, if you are isolating at home because someone else is poorly, here are things for you to do each weekday:

Maths (1 hour)	<p>Start the day off with some TTRockstars to get your brain in gear!</p> <p>Our current maths learning is all about measurement. English (1 hour)	<p>Start off your English learning each day by visiting Pobble and having a go at today's Question Time, Sentence Challenge and Sick Sentences. Don't forget to check the home learning page for spellings to practise.</p> <p>Our current English learning is all about diary writing. Pick a BBC Bitesize lesson to try: https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/articles/zmmj7nb This unit of work is split into 4 activities. Complete one activity each day. You can write as Grace Darling, or someone else of your choice.</p> <p>If you have done all of these, explore some more of the English catch-up lessons.</p>	

Other subjects (2 hours)

For your other lessons this week, try the activities below. You could spend two hours on one subject or split the time and do one hour on two different subjects. After you have fully explored a website, present your learning as a poster, PowerPoint slideshow, fact-page, scripted video or piece of writing. Be creative!



Topic - Research the discovery of King Tut's tomb. Create a fact page, comic or news article.

French - Continue to practice your French numbers - you could set up your own bingo game!

If you have visited all of those websites, try using [Kiddle](#)* to search the website for more facts and knowledge about our current topics (Egyptians, Electricity, Netball, playing the keyboard, French - where you live).
