





## Hello and welcome to the Year 5 Learning from Home Guide!



Good morning! Hopefully, we'll have a go at using Google Classroom tomorrow. For today, please have a look at the grid and do your best (Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> January).

Maths (1 hour)	<p>Have a go at this <a href="#">mental maths test</a> - I recommend starting on Level 3 and choosing whichever area of maths you want to practice.</p> <p>Revise prime numbers using this <a href="#">BBC Bitesize page</a>. If you would like a refresher, here is the <a href="#">prime number music video</a> that we watched in class last term.</p> <p>Afterwards, have a go at the <a href="#">Sumdog</a> challenge on prime numbers. Don't worry if you don't manage to finish it.</p>	
English (1 hour)	<p>Today, I'd like you to write a shape poem about a river. You can design your poem however you like and, when it's done, you can even decorate it! I will be looking for these things in your poetry:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>-similes (comparing the river to something else using the words <b>like</b> or <b>as</b>)</li><li>-metaphors (stating that the river is something else, for example: the <b>blue snake</b> slithered across the countryside)</li><li>-personification (giving the river feelings or motives)</li></ul>	
Art	<p>Download and look at the mountain art examples. For your artwork today, I'd like you to create a mountain scene using whatever you have available. You could use scrap leaflets, newspapers and leftover wrapping paper to create a collage. You could use a pencil to sketch a mountain, thinking carefully about shadows. If you have other art supplies, feel free to show me what you can do with them!</p>	

Please make sure you continue reading. Try to manage at least 20 minutes every day. Keep a note of what you read - you can complete AR quizzes when you come back to school!

Please keep all of your work safe so that you can show it to us when you come back to school. If you have any questions that your grown-up can't answer, make a note of them and we can always go through them when we are back together.
