YOUR CHILD COULD WIN A BOOK!

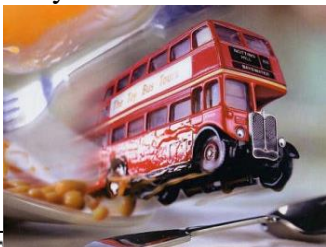
Please remember to tick the
